<p><b>William Syson Foundation</b></p>	<p>Discretionary</p>	<p>Open ~ rolling programme</p>	<p><b>William Syson Foundation</b></p> <p>The aim of this fund is to support projects and activities that promote the advancement of the arts, heritage, and culture. This includes, but is not limited to, the promotion and development of the arts, including music, the visual arts, theatre, and literature.</p> <p><b>Value Notes</b></p> <p>There are two tiers of funding for organisations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Small grants up to £5,000</li> <li>• Large grants from £5,001</li> </ul> <p><b>Who Can Apply</b></p> <p>The following are eligible to apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Charities registered in the UK.</li> <li>• Scottish charitable incorporated organisations (SCIOs).</li> <li>• Public sector organisations.</li> <li>• Voluntary or unincorporated associations.</li> <li>• Companies limited by guarantee where applicants can demonstrate clear public benefit objectives.</li> <li>• Community interest companies (CICs).</li> <li>• Charitable trusts.</li> <li>• Co-operatives.</li> </ul> <p><b>Eligible Expenditure</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Revenue costs associated with the delivery of services, such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Salaries or sessional staff costs.</li> <li>◦ Project costs, such activity costs, volunteer expenses or transport.</li> <li>◦ Core costs such as rent, heating or lighting.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Capital costs that will be used to improve or enhance services provided or increase usage of the facility. The applicant organisation must either own the assets or hold a long-term lease.</li> </ul> <p><b>How to Apply</b></p> <p>Applications are considered at meetings held throughout the year.</p>

<b>Petplan Charitable Trust</b>	Up to £25,000	Open ~ various deadlines	<p><b>Petplan Charitable Trust</b></p> <p>The aim of this fund is to support animal welfare by funding advances in veterinary science as well as the work of charities committed to animal welfare.</p> <p>There are two categories of funding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Welfare grants for the direct benefit of species supported by the Trust (i.e., dogs, cats, horses, and rabbits).</li> <li>• Scientific grants</li> </ul> <p><b>Value Notes</b></p> <p>There are two different grants:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Welfare grants typically range from £5,000 to £25,000.</li> <li>• Pump Primer/Pilot grants are up to £10,000.</li> </ul> <p><b>Who Can Apply</b></p> <p>Registered charities and scientific institutions are eligible to apply. For welfare grants, applicants must include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Extracts from most recent audited annual accounts.</li> <li>• Labelled photographs of where the animals are housed.</li> <li>• Name and contact number of a veterinary surgeon as a reference.</li> </ul> <p>Applicants must be able to demonstrate a reasonable record of rehoming.</p> <p><b>Eligible Expenditure</b></p> <p>Funding is intended to support the groundwork of animal welfare charities as well as advancements in veterinary medicine.</p> <p>Eligible activities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rescue and rehoming. (Personal visits may be required to check on the conditions of rescued animals.)</li> <li>• Animal housing maintenance and repairs.</li> <li>• Neutering and other veterinary services.</li> <li>• Clinical research into conditions</li> </ul>

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Animal welfare educational projects.</li> </ul> <p>Eligible costs include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Veterinary and research equipment.</li> <li>• Salaries.</li> <li>• Veterinary fees.</li> <li>• Vehicles.</li> </ul> <p><b>How to Apply</b> The next application deadlines are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Initial Scientific grants – 26 November 2021</li> <li>• Welfare grants – 10 December 2021</li> <li>• Pump/Pilot grants – 25 March 2022</li> </ul> <p>Guidance notes for each fund are available from the Petplan Charitable Trust website. <p><b>Ecclesiastical Insurance – 12 Days of Giving</b></p>	<p>Up to £1,000</p>	<p>Open ~ deadline 21/12/2021</p>	<p><b>12 Days of Giving Programme</b></p> <p>£120,000 – 120 Charities – 12 Days</p> <p>Now in its fourth year, the draw is open to any registered charity, not-for-profit organisation and community interest company in the UK, Republic of Ireland, Channel Islands or Isle of Man.</p> <p>Anyone can nominate their favourite charity to be entered into the draw which will take place each weekday from Monday 6 December until Tuesday 21 December 2021.</p> <p>Nominations will remain open until midnight the day before each draw. The 10 winners will be drawn at random so the more nominations a charity receives the greater the chance of winning.</p> <p><b>Value Notes</b></p>

			<p>Ten winners of £1,000 each will be drawn at random each weekday from 6-21 December 2021. <p><b>The Ireland Funds of Great Britain</b></p>	<p>Up to £10,000</p>	<p>Open ~ deadline 21/11/2021</p>	<p><b>The Ireland Funds</b></p> <p>The aim of this fund is to help organisations supporting communities across Great Britain and the isle of Ireland, whether of Irish descent or not.</p> <p>This year, the fund will support projects addressing the following themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Community Development.</li> <li>● Peace and Reconciliation.</li> <li>● Education.</li> <li>● Arts and Culture.</li> </ul> <p><b>Value Notes</b> Grants of between £1,000 and £10,000 are available. In previous rounds, the average grant awarded was for around £4,000.</p> <p><b>Who Can Apply</b> Not-for-profit and charitable organisations with an annual income of less than £1 million can apply. Applicants must be able to provide a copy of the organisation’s governing document (e.g., Constitution, Memorandum of Articles of Association) and the most recent set of Audited Accounts or bank statements.</p> <p><b>Location</b> Organisations that are based within Britain and the 32 counties of Ireland and Northern Ireland are eligible.</p> <p><b>How to Apply</b> There is a two-stage application process:</p>

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Organisations first submit a Letter of Enquiry, outlining their project. Letters must be submitted via an online portal which can be accessed on the website of The Ireland Funds of Great Britain. Letters of Enquiry for 2021 will be accepted from 8 November to 21 November (23:00).</li><li>• Successful organisations will then be invited to submit a detailed application for funding.
